(Approval of the Proposed Material Revision of Fenton Avenue Charter to Expand Grade Levels to Include Grades K-2 and 6) Recommends approval of the proposed material revision of the charter for Fenton Avenue Charter, located in Board District 6 and Local District Northeast, to add grades K-2 and 6 to its current TK, 3-5 program, thereby becoming a TK-6 school serving up to 832 students.

(Approval of the Proposed Material Revision of Fenton Primary Center to Expand Grade Levels to Include Grades 3-6) Recommends approval of the proposed material revision of the charter for Fenton Primary Center, located in Board District 6 and Local District Northeast, to add grades 3-6 to its current TK-2 program, thereby becoming a TK-6 school serving up to 840 students.
